Dr. Nirmala Buggi (Chief Health Officer (Clinical), BBMP), graced the occasion as the Chief Guest, while Most Rev. Duming Dias (Bishop of Karwar), presided over the event. In attendance were esteemed dignitaries including the Director, Associate Directors, Deans, Vice Deans, Registrar, CMS, and CNS.

A total of 163 AHS students, encompassing both Bachelor's and Master's candidates from various departments, graduated from SJMC. Bachelor's degrees conferred included BSc in MLT, MIT, PT, RTT, RDT, AOTT, and BPT, while Master's degrees included MPT in Musculoskeletal and Sports, Neurological and Psychosomatic Disorders, Cardio-respiratory Disorders, Pediatrics, and Community Physiotherapy, as well as MSc MLT in Biochemistry, Microbiology & Immunology, and Hematology & Blood transfusion, alongside MHA and DHA programs.

The event commenced with a formal graduation procession, followed by an inaugural song, bible reading, and lamp lighting ceremony. Rev. Fr. Jesudoss Rajamanickam (Director, SJNAHS) delivered the welcome address, followed by the presentation of the annual report by the Dean of the Medical College. 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# Inauguration of M-NICU "A paradigm shift in the care of small and sick newborn"

### **Department of Neonatology**

### 13<sup>th</sup> July 2024

St. John's Medical College Hospital, Bengaluru known for establishing one of the first neonatal intensive care units in the city has introduced a pioneering state-of-the-art Mother-Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (MNICU), a first in South India, emphasizing a "zero separation from birth" approach. This innovative unit is designed to implement Kangaroo Mothercare (KMC) immediately after birth, a practice strongly recommended by the World Health Organization for its critical role in reducing neonatal mortality and morbidity. The MNICU's application of KMC aims to decrease infant deaths and infections, mitigate complications like hypothermia, and foster early bonding and breastfeeding, thereby potentially shortening hospital stays. It is estimated that 4 million newborn lives can be saved every year by adapting this model across the world.

Rev. Fr. Jesudoss Rajamanickam (The Director, St John's National Academy of Health Sciences) along with the chief guest Dr. Ashok Deorari, (The Dean of Himalayan Institute Of Medical Sciences Dehradun) inaugurated the M-NICU on 13th July 2024. On this occasion, Dr. Basavaraj (Deputy Director Child Health Karnataka) and Dr. Amlin Shukla (Scientist from ICMR) were also present.

Speaking on the occasion the dignitaries expressed joy and hoped the new facility will be instrumental in opening a new dimension in the way we care for our newborn babies. Dr. Suman Rao (Head of Neonatology) who is leading this initiative said that "Currently the NICU separates these vulnerable babies from their mothers at a time when they need them the most...the M-NICU overcomes this barrier. Keeping the mother and the baby together helps the baby to survive and thrive. This is a total paradigm shift in the care of the small and sick newborn"

The hospital's M-NICU marks the first of its kind in the South of India in a private set-up amid the Indian healthcare ecosystem, with special focus on Kangaroo Mother Care and immediate skin-to-skin contact after birth. The vulnerable preterm and low birth weight newborns can now receive 24x7 high level intensive care facilities like non-invasive ventilation, CPAP, total parenteral nutrition, without being separated from the warm embrace of their mothers! The unit prioritises a "zero separation from birth" policy which means the mother and her newborn are cared together which in alignment with World Health Organization's (WHO) research which found the indisputable role of immediate-after-birth Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) in saving lives of neonates.

With ever-rising neonatal deaths due to prematurity and low birth weights, the establishment of M-NICUs has become the need of the hour. WHO's Immediate Kangaroo Mother Care (iKMC) trial, conducted in five centers, including India, focused on infants weighing 1 to 1.8 kgs. Research revealed that initiating KMC immediately after birth and prolonging its duration reduced neonatal deaths by 25%. This led to the establishment of M-NICUs, emphasizing the critical role of early initiation of continuous Kangaroo Mother Care in enhancing the survival of preterm infants.





Updates this month...

With the launch of their M-NICU, SJMCH aims to foster a supportive environment for new mothers and neonates alike. The hospital provides subsidized stays for families ensuring a holistic approach to care. With earmarked spaces for self-care and regular rounds by the obstetric and Neonatology teams, the M-NICU will be serving many mother-neonate dyads.

This M-NICU at SJMCH will serve as a model centre of excellence and in collaboration with the government of Karnataka and ICMR, SJRI and KHPT will replicate the same model in other districts in Karnataka such as Kolar, Koppal and Chitradurga.

This milestone aligns with the commitment for advancements in healthcare and the vision of St John's Medical College. This model is going to be replicated in many other centres across the state and country in association with the State and Central Government to have major impact of saving newborn lives.

By prioritizing Zero Separation, promoting Immediate Kangaroo Mother Care, and providing comprehensive support, a large number of sick and vulnerable newborns can dream of a bright future ahead.





Rev. Dr. Charles Davis, Reappointed as a Corresponding member of The Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life.

The Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life has reappointed Rev. Dr. Charles Davis (Associate Director – College) as a corresponding member for a second fiveyear term (2024-2029).

Fr. Davis left a government position to join the Jammu-Kashmir diocese, where he has since held numerous roles, including that of parish priest, judicial notary, principal, and personal secretary to the bishop.



His international experience includes chaplaincy at Frankfurt University Hospital and project coordination for a German-funded initiative at St. Joseph's Hospital in Baramulla, Kashmir.

Academically, Fr. Davis is distinguished by his Alexander von Humboldt Fellowship and dual PhDs from the Jesuit University of Sankt Georgen in Frankfurt and the Albert Ludwig University of Freiburg. He also holds a professorship in bioethics and moral theology.

His scholarly publications are widely referenced in university curricula. Notable works include "The Ethics of Human Embryonic Stem Cell Research: Proposals for a Legal Framework for India" and "Human Dignity in World Religions: Toward Global Bioethics and Biolaw."

His reappointment highlights his significant contributions to bioethics and moral theology on a global scale.

# Interactive Health Talk at Bangalore International Academy, Jayanagar


### 26<sup>th</sup> July 2024

The girl students of 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grades who had gathered for this rather taboo subject were surprisingly very enthusiastic, receptive, outgoing and inquisitive when the discussion started on basic concepts of understanding normal physiological body changes at puberty, the basics of menstruation, problems encountered in teens like premenstrual syndrome, menorrhagia, dysmenorrhea and PCOS. This was followed by a brief sensitization program on menstrual hygiene and dispelling some common myths associated with it in the society.

The packed audience were very vocal in enquiring their queries and surprisingly, they were very knowledgeable and aware of subjects like sanitary tampons, menstrual cups and even HPV vaccines! The session ended with a sensitization of teachers and Academic coordinators towards identifying the Danger signs or "Red Flags" and need for prompt referral of such children. The session ended with a Vote of Thanks and the management expressed their gratitude to Dr. Manjula for the talk and Rev. Fr. John Varghese, Associate Director, SJMCH, Dr. Rajkiran Raju and Mr Sachin K T (HoD, MSW Dept.) for facilitating the conduct of this event.





# **SURVIVOR's CORNER**

## A Difficult Case Managed Well!

Ms SK 29/F, case of bilateral Temporomandibular joint ankylosis with left facial nerve palsy was operated and treated for the same at St John's Medical College Hospital by Plastic surgery team led by Dr Vijay Joseph.

TMJ Ankylosis is a distressing condition which occurs when the bones of the lower jaw get fused to the upper jaw, preventing the patient from opening her mouth. In this case the patient sustained an injury to the lower jaw while playing when she was 5 years of age. Over a period of 4-5 year, she developed restriction of mouth opening and at 11yrs of age she underwent surgery for the same. After some initial relief for a couple of months, the ankylosis recurred. Due to financial constraints at home, they were not able to seek appropriate treatment.

On examination we found that she had a typical bird like face with a severely retruded and micrognathic mandible. After multiple discussions and evaluations, she underwent B/L TMJ ankylosis release with bilateral costochondral grafts (rib grafts for reconstruction) surgery. We had procured a stereolithographic model (3D) of the patient skull which was a valuable tool both pre and intra operatively. This helped to rehearse the surgery on the 3d model before the actual surgery. The final release of the bony fusion was done with a peizotome – a cutting edge ultrasonic cutting saw, which was made available in our hospital just this year, which helped us be as precise as possible. During surgery we were able to get a good mouth opening of around 4 cm.

Post operatively, she was stable, comfortable. She will now continue with further orthodontics treatment for further rehabilitation.

In the spirit of World Plastic surgery day, which is celebrated annually on the 15<sup>th</sup> July, with the permission of the management of our hospital we were able to provide completely free treatment to this patient which only made the success of this surgery so much sweeter.

### **Incentive** spirometer

This month the discussion is on the humble "Incentive spirometer".

The incentive spirometer, was first introduced by Robert H. Barlett in 1973, is a tool that promotes consistent, sustained maximal inspiration through visual feedback. It is commonly used because of its low risk, high efficacy, affordability, simplicity of usage, and safety profile. According to surveys, 71% to 95% of hospitals that perform abdominal and cardiothoracic procedures employ it.

There are different types of incentive spirometers, flow and volume incentive spirometer being the most common. Depending on the patient's assessment and the objective, a cardiopulmonary physical therapist should be able to guide on which one would be the most effective. The use of an incentive spirometer can vary from increasing lung volume and capacity to clearing secretions or maintaining bronchial hygiene. Incentive spirometry involves a sustained maximal inspiratory effort to expand collapsed alveoli. Typically, patients place the mouthpiece in their mouth and inhale through it. The prerequisites for incentive spirometry are a conscious, co-operative, motivated, carefully instructed and supervised patient, a cardiopulmonary physical therapist should be able to perform a thorough assessment to decide if incentive spirometer is advisable. Dosing of incentive spirometry to be effective depends heavily on the objective and the condition. In general, it should be used at least ten times per hour in every waking hour.

Unfortunately, the application of incentive spirometry remains an understudied in patients with tracheostomy although they are vulnerable to pulmonary complications. Prolonged periods of immobility, extended stays in the intensive care unit, compromised nutritional status, history of tobacco use and underlying chronic pulmonary conditions contribute to this. It is a matter of pride that, the department of Physiotherapy, St. John's has successfully developed a simple and inexpensive adaptor to assist patients with tracheostomy for using an incentive spirometer.

Its important to understand the mechanics and the usefulness of any device before prescription and this includes incentive spirometer! Keep calm (and warm) and let the cardiopulmonary physical therapist take care of your chest!

# COCONUT OIL – ANTIBIOTIC FOR DENGUE??!!

**CLAIM**: A message that has gone viral on WhatsApp, makes the following claim:


'This message is to inform you all that dengue viral is going on. So please use coconut oil below your knees till your footsteps. It is a antibiotic. And a dengue mosquito can not fly higher than the knees. So please keep this in mind and start using it. Spread this message to as much as you can. Your one message can save many life's.'

**FACT CHECK:** Dengue is caused by a virus and not a bacterium. The virus is introduced into the blood stream through the mosquito injecting the virus directly into the blood stream of the person.

- Coconut oil is composed of saturated fats that does not have either antiviral or anti-bacterial properties.
- In any case, coconut oil applied to the skin will not penetrate into the blood stream to mediate it's effects.
- The Aedes mosquito which transmits the dengue virus can access and bite any part of the body, not just below the knees.

**CONCLUSION**: The contents of this message are false. Applying coconut oil is not a mosquito repellent not an antibacterial/ antiviral. The best ways to prevent dengue are to eliminate sources of stagnant water around the house and taking preventive measures from mosquitoes entering the house and biting people.











## Department of Com DEALL- Early Intervention Program for Children with Autism Spectrum Disorder

### Introduction:

St. John's Com DEALL Early Intervention Center is designed to offer a holistic early intervention program for children with autism spectrum disorders and other developmental disorders.

The Center was inaugurated on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2022 by former Director, Rev. Dr. Paul Parathazham, Rev. Fr. John Varghese (ADH), Rev. Fr. Jesudoss Rajamanickam, (the present Director), Rev. Fr. Tony (ADF), Dr. Arvind Kasthuri (Chief of Medical Services) and Late Dr. M. V. Ashok (Chief Coordinator of CAREADD).



The Communication DEALL program is the brainchild of Dr. Prathibha Karanth, a renowned expert in Speech-Language Pathology in India with over 40 years of experience and expertise in language disorders. The acronym DEALL stands for <u>D</u>evelopmental <u>E</u>clectic <u>A</u>pproach to <u>L</u>anguage <u>L</u>earning. The Com DEALL Early intervention program, launched in 2000, was a pioneering initiative in India, offering a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach to group therapy in early intervention. Late Dr. Ashok, Professor Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and the Chief Coordinator of CAREADD SJRI, was associated with the Com DEALL program and was a well-wisher of the program since 2008.

The SJMCH-Com DEALL program is an exceptional evidence-based intervention program designed to offer high-quality group intervention to children with autism spectrum disorders. This is in alignment with the best practices in autism intervention across the world. We aim to facilitate the integration of as many children as possible into mainstream inclusive schools and to foster the development of independent functional living skills.

In addition, the Centre offers other groups such as the **Pre DEALL group** (a parent-child group intervention, age range – 18 to 36 months) for 10 months, and the **Social Communication Group** (SCG – designed for school-going children, age range 4 -7 years) for 9 months.

#### Parental involvement in Com DEALL Program

The team strongly emphasize incorporating parent training and counseling sessions as an essential component of the program. Active parental involvement in therapy sessions and complete transparency is ensured. Using various Com DEALL Intervention Manuals and Communicaids, we aim to empower parents and help the family to take lead in achieving overall developmental skills in children. Periodically, professionals and experienced parents conduct interactive sessions with families to enrich and support them on different aspects of intervention. Many families approach our program through growing referrals from previous parents, who attest to the positive impact of our intervention program on both the child and the family's well-being. This illustrates the important role of parents and play as advocates for our program.

All our programs focus on the overall development of each child through personalized strength-based intervention. It begins by identifying specific areas where children with autism mostly require support, such as prerequisite learning skills, sensory motor skills, oral motor skills, functional communication skills and toileting readiness skills.

The key feature of the Com DEALL program is its multidisciplinary approach. Families can access various professionals under one roof. Teamwork is highly valued, and therapy sessions are led by a team of professionals from different disciplines, including speech-language pathologists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, and developmental educators/psychologists.

#### **Family Mediated Intervention Program**

The Family Mediated Intervention Program (FMIP) is aimed at reaching out to families who often struggle to attend Com DEALL's regular therapy sessions due to various factors such as lack of time, financial constraints, or limited access to intervention facilities in their vicinity. Through this model, we encourage the family to take the initiative to work with their children and become the primary therapist for their child.

#### **Other Clinical Activities**

• Summer Camp, Awareness Program, Training Program, Internship, Intellectual Pursuits.

**Summer Camp**: Apart from the clinical activities, our team is enthusiastically conducting fun-filled summer camps for children with Autism.







#### **Awareness Programs**

- On World Autism Awareness Day, April 2, 2023, the department organized autism awareness activities in the park near SJMCH Com DEALL, Kalyan Nagar. The activities were:
- Distributing leaflets about autism to the public.
- Displaying posters on autism by professionals and parents to the public.
- Handing out bookmarks with awareness messages to the public.
- On this World Autism Awareness Day 2024, our therapists visited neighborhood preschools to create awareness about SJMCH Com DEALL Early Intervention program and to establish collaboration with preschools for a successful, seamless transition from early intervention to preschool setup.
- The therapists visited clinics and hospitals in the neighborhood to create awareness. This will also be an ongoing initiative for this year.

### **Training Programs Offered**

- Parent training sessions with a focus to enhance knowledge in various/numerous topics related to the development of children.
- Training for other professionals on request.
- Hands-on training sessions will be provided to preschool teachers working with children with special needs.

### Internship

Internships are offered to students who have completed their Bachelors in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (BASLP) from various colleges in Karnataka and other states. These interns are placed in the center for periods ranging from 1 to 2 months. We offer orientation sessions and expose them to the different clinical activities including case presentation and communicaid presentation.

### **Intellectual Pursuits**

Twice a month, on Wednesdays, we hold in-house topic presentations and a journal club led by therapists specializing in various areas.



# Did You Know?


SILFRA Fissure – In Iceland is a gap in between two tectonic plates namely North American and Eurasian. This gap is slowly widening over many years.

A Bird's Eye View.....

### **Pyogenic liver abscess and colorectal cancer**

Studies from Asia suggest that pyogenic liver abscess is associated with increased incidence of colorectal cancer, but studies outside Asia are scarce. In a 10-year retrospective study from 120 hospitals in the United States, the incidence of colorectal cancer among over 8000 patients with liver abscess was almost fourfold higher during the first six months after diagnosis of liver abscess compared with 23,000 matched controls without liver abscess. The correlation was not observed among patients whose liver abscess was due to cholangitis or cholecystitis, and the type of organism causing the abscess did not correlate with the incidence of cancer. These findings support prompt screening for colorectal cancer in patients with pyogenic liver abscess, particularly in patients without an underlying hepatobiliary cause.



### Updated guideline on postoperative delirium in adults

The European Society of Anaesthesiology and Intensive Care Medicine has published an updated guideline on postoperative delirium (POD). Recommendations include preoperatively screening older adults for risk factors for POD and multicomponent nonpharmacological interventions for all patients with risk factors. In addition, review of recent evidence showed that perioperative use of dexmedetomidine was associated with a lower incidence of POD, particularly when administered postoperatively in the intensive care unit. We agree with the recommendations and often use dexmedetomidine in the perioperative period to reduce the incidence of POD in high-risk patients.
